

Urgent Care or Walk-in Clinics

In an emergency, call 911 right away!


Urgent Care Clinics are clinics where you do not need to make an appointment. You can visit these clinics when something happens that is important to fix quickly, but is not a big emergency. For example, if you feel very sick and cannot wait for an appointment, or if you have a cut that is bleeding a lot but is not life-threatening.

Before you visit, call or visit the website to make sure that the office is open and provides the service that you need. They will also ask you about your insurance, so make sure you have your insurance card or a picture of both sides of it. You can tell them that you have insurance through LewerMark, and the network name is First Health.

When you arrive, you must show them your insurance card and a photo ID (passport, driver's license, or other ID card. If you don't have any of these, bring your Shoreline ID card). You may have to pay \$20 for an office co-pay.

How to get your insurance card:

1. Visit www.lewemark.com/shoreline and click on the button that says **"Print your ID Card"**
2. Log in with your Student ID and your birthdate (if you are logging in for the first time). You will be asked to change your password.
3. There is a menu button at the top left corner. You should be able to view and print your ID card. We recommend that you print a copy and download the PDF to your phone.



If you are under the age of 18, you may need additional paperwork for non-emergency situations. We recommend that you call the clinic you would like to visit before you go. Their policies may change without notifying the college. On the list on the back of this page, **Swedish Edmonds Urgent Care** only requires a copy of the medical release from your application. You can get a copy of this from International Education.

*This clinic will accept the medical release form included in your application. Please visit IE to get a copy and bring it to the clinic when you visit. You can also go with a host parent.

**These clinics will not accept the medical release form included in your application. However, you may visit with your host parent or contact the clinic to ask about their process for verbal authorization (for example, permission that your parent gives by calling the clinic directly).

^These clinics require verbal authorization from a parent or guardian (phone call may be okay) or an official legal document called Power of Attorney.
